Luftwaffe	The air force of Nazi Germany
Evacuation	The process of moving people away from an area where they are in danger to a safer area.
Ration	Rationing was introduced in Britain in January 1940. Certain foods such as butter, bacon, and sugar, were restricted and people could only buy a limited amount
Blitz	'Blitz' is an abbreviation of the German word 'blitzkrieg', meaning 'lightning war'. Its explosive sound describes the Luftwaffe's almost continual aerial bombardment of the British Isles from September 1940 to May 1941.

Key Learning

- ✓ Know that blood travels around the body transporting nutrients that have been absorbed into the bloodstream from digestion
- ✓ Know that blood carries oxygen around the body; the use of oxygen to create energy is called respiration
- ✓ Know that the heart beats, pumping blood around the body
- ✓ Know that blood vessels carry blood: arteries carry blood away from the heart; veins carry blood towards the heart
- ✓ Know that when we exercise, our heart beats more frequently so that the oxygen that is used can be replenished
- ✓ Know that drugs can be harmful or helpful, depending on what they are and how they are used

nutrients	a substance that provides nourishment essential for the maintenance of life and for growth.
respiration	The process of taking in oxygen for energy production and releasing carbon dioxide.
blood vessel	Tubes that deliver blood around the body.

vein	Blood vessels that carry blood back to the heart
