Key Learning

- ✓ *Primary colours are mixed to create secondary colours*
- ✓ *Brown is made by mixing: -all the primary colours - 2 complementary colours.*
- ✓ *Tints are created by adding white Tones are created by adding black- more complex colour wheel.*
- ✓ *Match thick and thin brushes according to purpose.*
- ✓ *Texture in paintings -add different things to it e.g. sand, sawdust, wood shavings etc*

Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
Primary colours	The basic colours which can be mixed together to make new colours: red, blue, yellow.
Secondary colours	The colours created by mixing two primary colours together (e.g. green can be created by mixing blue and yellow together)
Abstract art	A form of art which doesn't represent images as we see them in everyday life. This style of art is not designed to represent an actual object.
Repeating pattern	A series repeated more than once.

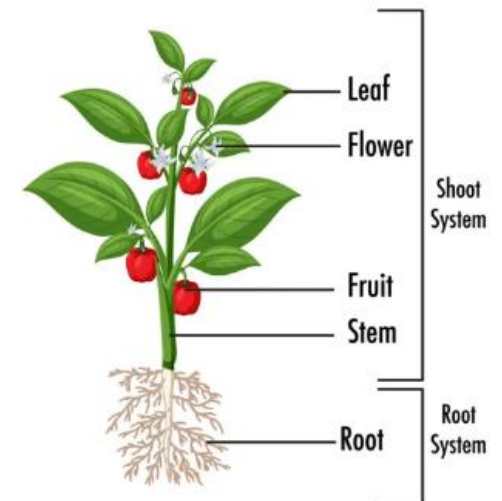
Science Plants



- ✓ To identify and name at least 2 garden plants and two wild plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. (Y1)
- ✓ To identify leaves, flowers, petals, fruit, roots, bulbs, seeds, trunk, branches, stem. (Y1)

deciduous	a tree or shrub shedding its leaves annually
evergreen	an evergreen is a plant which has foliage that remains green and functional through more than one growing season
germination	Germination is the process by which a plant grows from a seed into a seedling.
reproduction	Plant reproduction is the production of new offspring in plants

Word	Definition
Torah	The Torah is the compilation of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible.
Simchat Torah	a Jewish holiday that celebrates and marks the conclusion of the annual cycle of public Torah readings
Synagogue	sometimes referred to as a shul or a temple, is a house of worship in Judaism
Bimah	the podium or platform in a synagogue from which the Torah and Prophets are read
Aron Kodesh	an ornamental chamber in the synagogue that houses the Torah scrolls
Mezuzah	a sacred Jewish object placed on the threshold into the home, which blesses and sanctifies their living space
