- ✓ To know that the Shang Dynasty was the first Chinese Dynasty for which there is written and archaeological evidence.

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Properties & Changes of Materials

Key Learning

- ✓ To know that something is soluble when it is able to be dissolved, especially in water
- ✓ To understand that when a solid does dissolve in a liquid it is described as being soluble
- ✓ To understand that some materials are soluble in water and some not.
- ✓ To know methods of separating materials, e.g. filtering, sieving and evaporating.
- ✓ To know that a reversible change is one that can be reversed
- ✓ To know that filtering allows solids and liquids to be separated.
- ✓ To know that sieving allows solids, made up of different sized parts, to be separated.
- ✓ To understand properties: hardness, transparency, conductivity (thermal and electric), and magnetic.
- ✓ To know a property and the associated use of metals, wood and plastic.

Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
Irreversible	A change that cannot be changed back again.
Conductivity	Whether a material allows thermal or electrical energy to pass through it.
Crystallisation	The process of liquid cooling into crystals.
Magnetic	An invisible force or field that causes objects to attract or repel one another
