Lulworth and Winfrith Primary School is a small Church of England school, set in the heart of the beautiful Dorset countryside, where the woods meet the sea. Set on two sites, the children receive “outstanding education in a beautiful setting” (Ofsted).

Our children’s learning and social development is central to everything we do. We provide a variety of learning experiences, in order to develop thinking and questioning minds and to encourage individual opinions and views.

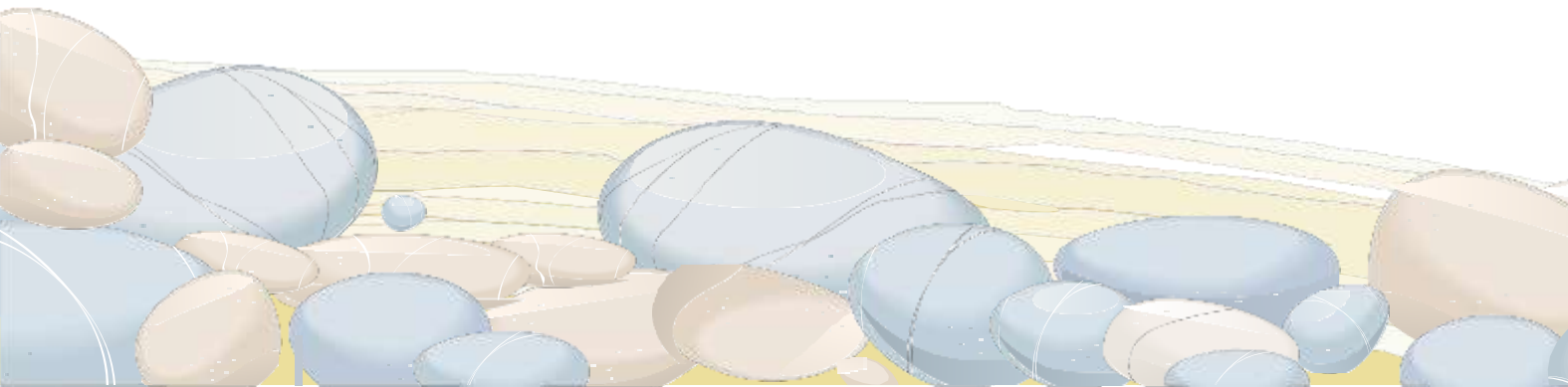
Lulworth and Winfrith Primary School is a safe and secure school, where every child matters. Children are happy here.

We provide a stimulating, personalised learning environment. We believe that each child is important and provide support that is tailored to the individual.

Our small class groups ensure consistent progression, with the children feeling safe to ask questions, make mistakes and help set their own targets to move their learning forward.

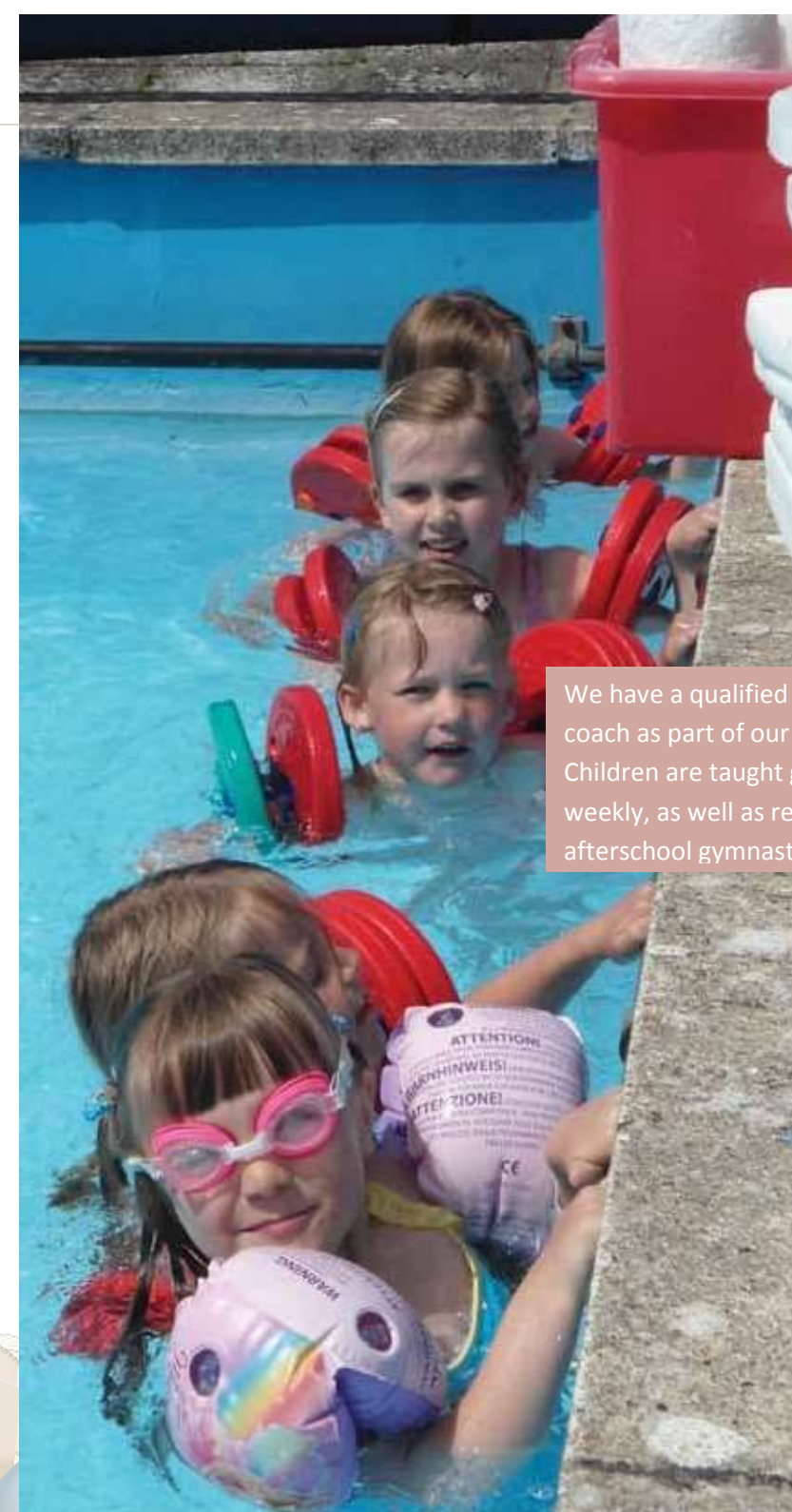


Care for all children at the end of the school day

Our strong links with parents and carers help us to support each child's social, moral and academic development. We:

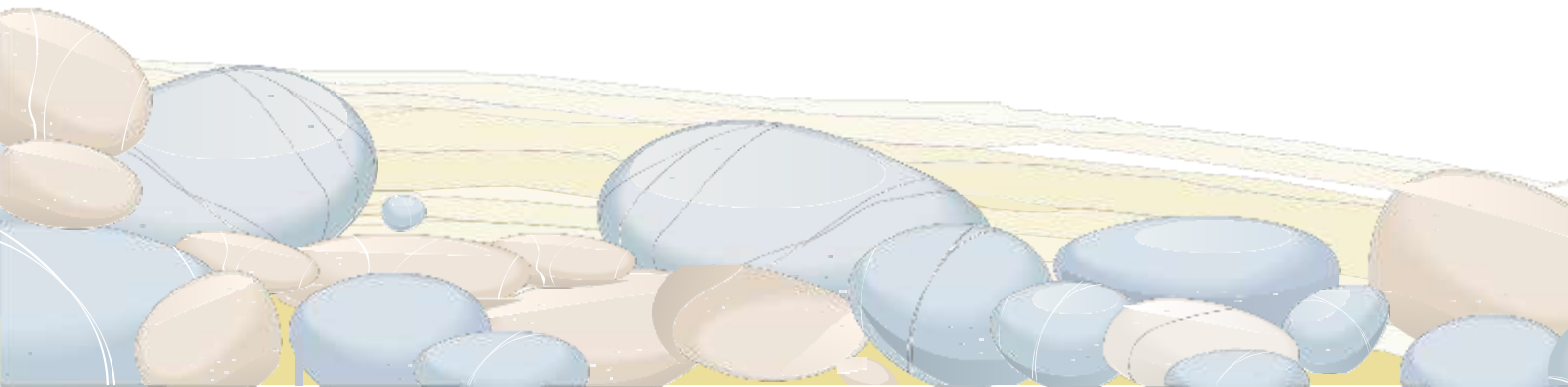
- have an open-door policy

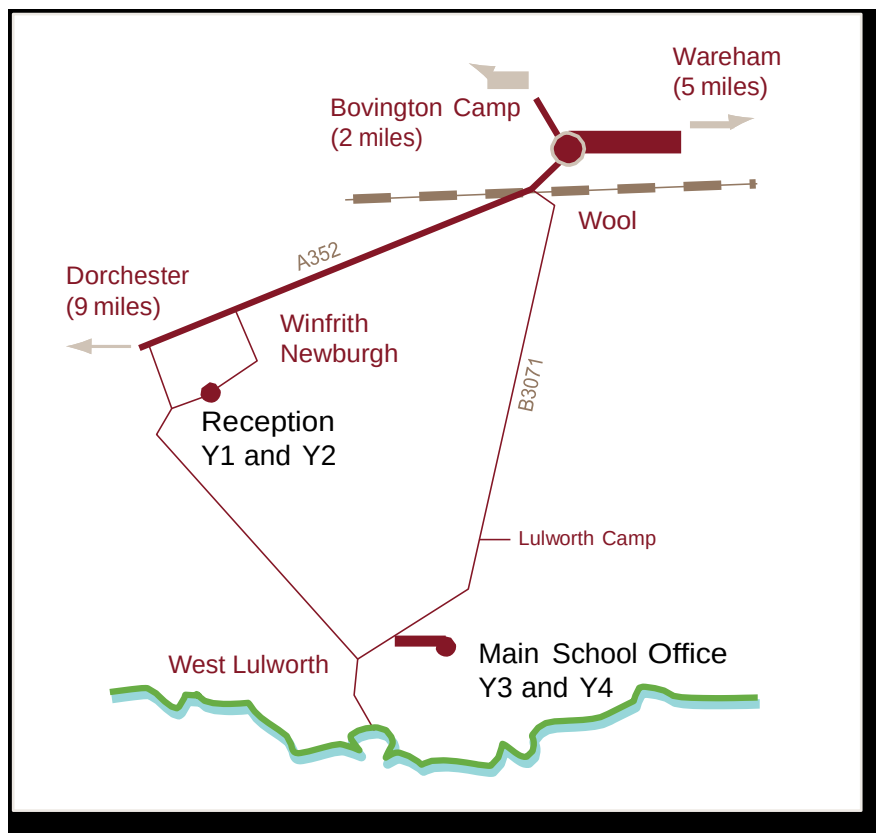




Our values of belief, fellowship and harmony permeate all that we do. Through these values we believe that your child will grow as an individual morally, socially, emotionally and spiritually.
