Dear Families,

The school was a flurry of colour and costumes this week when our school community embraced the celebrations of World Book Day! Staff and children engaged in a range of different activities from decorating potatoes to going on book trails. This day gave us the opportunity to continue to promote the importance of reading, and it was great to hear the children share the authors and texts they are enjoying now. A love of reading really does help to extend vocabulary and open routes to learning in other areas. We hope each child has brought their Book Token safely home so that they can use it to make a purchase from a bookshop nearby.

We have faced a lot of rainy days recently and, unfortunately, a lot of wet school drop offs and pickups! Sometimes the rain can lead us to try and race undercover quickly, and I therefore want to take this opportunity to ask for your help in ensuring safety is our joint key priority for the start and the end of the school day. Keeping our children safe on their journey to and from school is everyone's responsibility. Whether walking, scooting, cycling or arriving by car, we all need to take extra care.

For Drivers

- Please park **safely and considerately**.
- Do not park on pavements, zig-zags or across driveways. Be mindful of the need for minibuses to gain access to the school sites.
- Avoid stopping where it blocks children's view of the road.
- Drive slowly and carefully near the school site.
- A few extra minutes of care can make a big difference to everyone's safety.

For Children Walking

- Always walk on the pavement, well away from the road.
- Stop, look both ways, and listen before crossing.
- Use a safe crossing place where possible.
- Never run across the road.

For Children Scooting or Cycling

- Follow the Highway Code rules.
- Stop at the kerb and check carefully before crossing.
- Ride sensibly and be aware of people around you.
- Walk your scooter or bike across once you reach the entrance to the school site

A Reminder for Families

Only children who have permission from school are allowed to travel to and from the school site without an adult. If you are unsure, please contact the school office.

How Parents Can Help at Home

- Here are some simple ways to reinforce road safety messages:
- Practise "Stop, Look, Listen, Think" together.
- Ask your child: "Where is the safest place to cross?"
- Role-play different road situations.
- Remind children to remove headphones and not look at phones when walking to and from school. Underline the importance of staying alert near roads.
- Talk about why parking safely protects all children, not just your own.

Working together, we can make sure every child arrives at school and home safely each day. Thank you for your continued support in keeping our school community safe.

Science Corner for Children

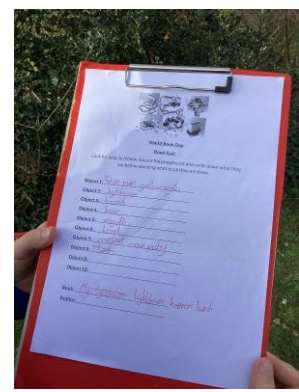
Last week we asked Where does glass come from? How is it changed into something we can use? Glass is made by melting sand, soda ash, and limestone together at extremely high temperatures at over 1,700°C in a furnace. The mixture turns into a glowing, gooey liquid that can be moulded, stretched, or blown into shapes like bottles and windows before cooling into solid glass.

Glass is transformed into usable products through a recycling process that involves cleaning, sorting by colour, crushing into a raw material called cullet, and re-melting in a furnace at high temperatures. Because glass is 100% recyclable and never loses its quality, it can be endlessly melted down and reshaped into new containers, such as bottles and jars, or processed into alternative materials.
