Dear Families,

We hope that the World Book Day celebrations will be extra special as the children will spend the day together on the Lulworth site and have lots of opportunities for interacting with different year groups.

Parents and carers often feedback that leaving Sports Day until the last few weeks of the academic year can be quite a juggle to manage as there are lots of other commitments taking place at that time of year. The start of a new half term is always a great opportunity for staff to revisit our school values with each class. When speaking to your child, they may well talk about our school vision ('to grow from something small into something mighty') and our values of Belief, Fellowship and Harmony. Within our discussions we often explore examples of what each value looks like in practice. For example, we encourage the children to consider what their interactions with others will sound or look like if it is respectful. Similarly, when tackling a learning task in the classroom, we invite pupils to consider how approaching it with aspiration could be helpful.

As you know, we also encourage our children to strive to show these school values beyond the school gates. It is always lovely to receive an email from a parent or for a family member to handover to school staff that a child has persevered to get dressed independently/complete a home learning task/learn how to hop. We strive to help all children to thrive and by working with each family, we know we can help each other to nurture these important values. Please do keep sharing with us any stories of success in these areas so we can celebrate your child's achievements with you!

Finally, you may remember that earlier in the autumn term, we invited you to complete a survey to help us review our school vision and values and help us to shape what this will be as we look towards the future. In addition, we have sought contributions from governors and spent time talking to staff and children about the Christian values they think we should focus on and what our school ethos should aim to live out. Over the next few weeks, all this feedback will be collated in the hope we can share our new, reviewed school vision with everyone before the end of the school year.

Science Corner for Children

Last week we asked: How are clothes made? What materials are used to make them?

Clothes are produced through a multi-stage process: **designing, pattern making, fabric selection, cutting, stitching, and finishing**. Materials (natural or synthetic) are woven or knitted, cut based on templates, and assembled by workers, often specialising in specific tasks, before undergoing quality control and packaging.

This week's question: **Where does glass come from? How is it changed into something we can use?**
