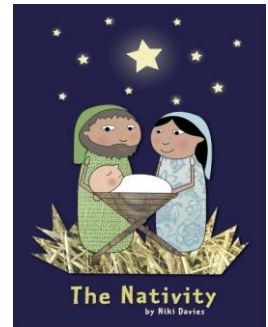
A Wonderful Nativity Celebration!
