This week began with our Odd Socks Day as we launched Anti-Bullying Week 2025. The theme this year is Power for Good, and the children have engaged with an assembly and activities aimed at empowering young people to use their Power for Good to safely speak up and raise awareness when they see bullying, face to face or online. We all have a part to play, and we want to work together to use our Power for Good to end bullying - for good!

On Tuesday we held a short period of silence as one of our acts of remembrance. Last weekend many children and their families took part in Remembrance parades across our parish and lots of children have talked about either representing the school when stood with their mum/dad who currently serves in the armed forces, or some have worn rainbow/beaver/cub/scout/guide uniforms and paraded with a flag. We have also had positive feedback following our engagement with West Purbeck Benefice about the poppies crafted to decorate the local churches. In school, we have joined in poignant discussions and during assembly, pupils showed respect as they silently reflected on the sacrifices made by service men and women.

In addition, we have also held our Maths Workshops for parents/carers where we invited you into school to find out more about the maths teaching and learning in our school. We hope you found the session useful, and we know the children enjoyed engaging in maths games with you and showing you some of the tasks they have been undertaking recently. If you were able to come along, we want to thank you for giving up your time to support the school in this way.

Finally, our fabulous PTFA have been busy again this week and have got together to start planning the upcoming Christmas Fayre on Thursday 4th December. Please keep that afternoon free so that you can come along and enjoy the festivities after school at the Lulworth school site. There will be lots of different opportunities coming up including offering to run stalls and providing donations for tombola prizes. Every little helps and we continue to be very grateful to the PTFA for their efforts and generosity!
