Science Corner for Children

Last week we asked: **Where does paper come from? Why should we try not to waste it?** Paper is primarily made from wood pulp, which comes from cellulose fibres in trees (mostly softwoods like pine and spruce) that are grown on tree farms or in managed forests. The process involves harvesting trees, breaking them down into fibres, mixing them with water to form pulp, and pressing and drying this pulp into sheets.

Trying not to waste paper is a crucial environmental practice because its production is a highly resource-intensive process that contributes significantly to deforestation, pollution, and global warming. About 4 billion trees are cut down annually for paper, comprising over 40% of all wood pulp traded globally.
